# 1. General Information

## 1.1 What is AutoCAD LT 2008?

AutoCAD LT® 2008 software is the world's number-one-selling 2D drafting and detailing product. For design professionals who require full DWG native file format compatibility without 3D capabilities, advanced customization, or network licensing, AutoCAD LT makes daily work simpler because it's designed with the drafter in mind. Minimize time-consuming workarounds with annotation scaling and layer properties per viewport while refining your aesthetic precision with text and table enhancements and multiple leaders. You'll also work smarter with existing features like Dynamic Blocks and Express Tools. Your work goes quicker. Your day goes smoother. And your tools just keep getting better.

## 1.2 Who uses AutoCAD LT?

AutoCAD LT is used by architects, CAD technicians, designers, engineers, project managers, and CAD/IT managers in a variety of industries including the building, manufacturing, civil and mapping industries.

For example, AutoCAD LT is used by:

- Design professionals who create technical drawings and have no need for automation of repetitive design steps or additional functionality provided by third-party applications
- Drafters who put the finishing touches on a design with detailing, annotations, links to online data, and verification of accuracy
- Contractors, suppliers, or operational professionals who need to review a drawing to extrapolate data specific to their businesses
- Principals and project leaders who need to review and edit a drawing and monitor progress

AutoCAD LT 2006 streamlined the tasks you perform every day. Hatching became more flexible, dimensioning was improved, and text editing was enhanced to work the way you always wanted it to. AutoCAD LT 2007 enabled designers to work even faster and smarter with powerful new features such as Dynamic Blocks and Express Tools for better layer management.

Now, AutoCAD LT 2008 builds on previous releases and provides improved drafting functionality. With automated annotation scaling and layer properties per viewport, workarounds are a thing of the past. Text and table feature enhancements, along with multiple leaders, take you to the next level of productivity.

- Network Licensing
- Sheet Set Management
- Presentation Graphics
- CAD Standards management

## 2. Availability and Pricing

### 2.1 When will AutoCAD LT 2008 be available?

AutoCAD LT 2008 software will be available worldwide in English, German, and Japanese in March of 2007.

### 2.2 When can I expect localized versions of AutoCAD LT 2008 to ship?

Autodesk plans to ship localized versions for French, Spanish, Italian, Korean, Traditional Chinese, Russian, Czech, and Polish. Autodesk also plans to provide documentation localized for Norway, Sweden, Netherlands, Denmark, and Finland. Autodesk will announce the expected ship dates as the localized versions become available.

### 2.3 What is the price for AutoCAD LT 2008?

Prices may vary by country and reseller. Contact an Autodesk Authorized Reseller for pricing information. In addition to full purchases of AutoCAD LT 2008 software, upgrades are available from AutoCAD LT 2005, 2006, and 2007 versions.

### 2.4 Is subscription available for AutoCAD LT 2008?

### 2.5 Who is eligible for an upgrade to AutoCAD LT 2008?

If you own an AutoCAD LT 2005, 2006, or 2007 software license, you are eligible to purchase the upgrade version of AutoCAD LT 2008.

### 2.6 Can I try AutoCAD LT 2008 before I buy it?

Yes, you can try it out by requesting an AutoCAD LT 2008 trial version. This full-functioning version of AutoCAD LT 2008 is available as a free<sup>†</sup> 30-day trial. You can order the Trial CD from your Autodesk Authorized Reseller or online at [www.autodesk.com/autocadlt-trialcd](http://www.autodesk.com/autocadlt-trialcd).

### 2.7 Are there special purchase programs available for educational institutions or students?

## **3. Compatibility**

### **3.1 Has the AutoCAD LT 2007 DWG drawing file format changed for AutoCAD LT 2008.**

No, AutoCAD LT 2008 uses the same DWG file format as AutoCAD LT 2007.

### **3.2 Does AutoCAD LT 2008 read and save drawings created by earlier releases of AutoCAD?**

AutoCAD LT 2008 reads drawing files from all previous versions of AutoCAD LT and AutoCAD software.

AutoCAD LT 2008 has a built-in SaveAs function so you can save drawings to and from AutoCAD LT releases using the 98, 2000, and 2004 DWG format(s). In addition, you can use the SaveAs AutoCAD Release 12 DXF™ command to support releases prior to AutoCAD LT 98.

### **3.3 Is AutoCAD LT 2008 interoperable with other Autodesk products?**

Yes, AutoCAD LT 2008 is built with the same technology as AutoCAD 2008 so sharing data is seamless. It enables that the next generation of Autodesk products to be interoperable with AutoCAD LT 2008. These include Autodesk® 3ds Max®, Autodesk® VIZ 2008, Autodesk® Design Review, Autodesk® DWF™ Viewer 2008, and DWG TrueView™ 2008, as well as the industry-specific AutoCAD-based products: AutoCAD® Architecture 2008, AutoCAD® Map 3D 2008, AutoCAD® Civil 3D® 2008, AutoCAD® Electrical, and AutoCAD® Mechanical applications.

### **3.4 Can I run AutoCAD LT 2008 side by side with other AutoCAD-based applications?**

Yes, AutoCAD LT 2008 can be installed side by side with AutoCAD as well as any AutoCAD-based version of Autodesk's industry-specific products, including AutoCAD Architecture, AutoCAD Map 3D, AutoCAD Civil 3D, AutoCAD Electrical, AutoCAD Mechanical, Revit® Architecture, and Autodesk® Inventor™ software.

### **3.5 Do AutoCAD LT 2006 / AutoCAD LT 2007 customized menus work in AutoCAD LT 2008?**

Yes, AutoCAD LT 2008 will automatically migrate customized menus (CUI files). The first time you launch AutoCAD LT 2008 the migration feature will ask you if you would like to migrate your settings from your previous AutoCAD LT version to AutoCAD LT 2008. The migration feature helps you make a smooth transition to the new release by automatically migrating customized menus, hatch patterns, linetypes, command short cuts, and profiles. ### **3.6 Do AutoCAD LT 2006 or earlier customized menus work in AutoCAD LT 2008?**

Yes, AutoCAD LT 2008 will load customized menus (.mns /.mnu /.mnr files). Once loaded they will be converted to a .CUI (Customize User Interface) file and can be used with AutoCAD LT 2008. By using the migration feature AutoCAD LT 2008 will set your support files location for files such as menus and toolbar icons. Alternatively you can use the CUI

editor to move your customizations to the AutoCAD LT 2008 menu. For additional migration tools, refer to [www.autodesk.com/migrationtools](http://www.autodesk.com/migrationtools).

### **3.7 Can AutoCAD LT 2008 work with custom objects created in Autodesk industry-specific software?**

Yes, the AutoCAD LT 2008 software application can read custom objects created in Autodesk products that use RealDWG™ technology to create those objects. With the AutoCAD LT 2008 application you can view these objects automatically using object enablers—you do not have to install any special plug-ins or viewers. For example, if you need to review a building floor plan created in AutoCAD Architecture 2008, you simply open the drawing file; the 3D wall and window objects that are part of a drawing are instantly viewable, and all the associated data is available.

## **4. Platform and System Requirements**

### **4.1 What are the system requirements for AutoCAD LT 2008?**

The recommended system requirements for AutoCAD LT 2008 are as follows:

- Intel® Pentium® 4, 2.2 GHz Recommended
- Microsoft® Windows Vista™ Home Basic, Home Premium, Ultimate, Business and Enterprise, XP Home & Professional SP2, Windows® 2000 SP4
- 512 MB RAM
- 550 MB free disk space for installation
- 1024x768 VGA with True Color
- Microsoft® Internet Explorer® 6.0 SP1 or higher

### **4.2 Does AutoCAD LT 2008 support 64-bit operating systems?**

Not at this time. AutoCAD LT 2008 does not support 64-bit Windows. However, it does support running on an Intel EM64T processor using Window XP 32 bit.

### **4.3 Is AutoCAD LT 2008 Logo Certified for Windows Vista?**

AutoCAD 2008 has achieved the “Works with Windows Vista” logo. The logo indicates that AutoCAD 2008 will run smoothly and reliably in the Windows Vista operating system environment.

## **5. Licensing**

### **5.1 Does AutoCAD 2008 LT use product activation for stand-alone licenses?**

Yes, with the release of AutoCAD LT 2005 the process formerly referred to as “authorization” was replaced by the more industry-standard “product activation.” AutoCAD LT 2008 will continue to use product activation.

### **5.2 What is product activation?**

Product activation is a software-based license management technology incorporated into many Autodesk products. It is a secure and trouble-free process that authenticates licensed users running Autodesk software. The process verifies that the serial number is legitimate and has not been activated on more computers than are eligible. It does not affect the ability of licensed users to operate their software the way they have always done. It is similar to the authorization mechanism in Autodesk products in the past but provides additional capabilities for security and special product versions (such as student and trial versions).

### 5.3 Why is Autodesk requiring Autodesk customers to activate their software?

Product activation is a simple way to reduce and deter unauthorized use and casual copying of Autodesk products, with little to no impact on our loyal customers.

### 5.4 How do I activate my software?

Through the activation and registration interface, you can activate your product 24 hours a day, seven days a week, over the Internet or via email. Either option takes only a few steps to complete and requires your product serial number and registration information.

### 5.5 What if I have more than one computer? Will product activation allow me to use the software on multiple machines?

Autodesk recognizes that some users may need to operate the software when they are away from their usual work location. To accommodate this need, the product activation technology and the AutoCAD LT End-User License Agreement allows an employee to install the software on a second computer owned by the employee's company, provided it is for use away from the employee's usual work location, the two copies are only used by that employee and no other, and only one copy of the software is ever in use at any one time.
